



Coronation Elation

Gemma Taylor and family braved the rain and the crowds to witness the Coronation procession in London

It's early. Gloriously sunny, the birds heralding this special day. We've been waiting less than a year. He's been waiting a lifetime.

The train pulls in, intensity builds, children fizzing with excitement for this adventure to London to see the King. There are no expectations, only the desire to be part of the crowds, soak it in, this special moment in history.

A busy calm has descended on Waterloo. The city holding its breath and, for now, the sun smiling on happy crowds with vistas along the route.

Stewards herd us along, we squeeze into the last nook together, shoulder to shoulder. Beyond all hopes, we can see the actual road where the procession will go and release a small murmur of triumph.

Sons on shoulders, daughters held high, mobile phones aloft - the moment has come. The Royal Procession turns off Trafalgar Square, Lord Nelson looking on as cheering cascades down Whitehall, a Mexican wave of Union Jack-speckled euphoria. Horse hooves resounding, distant drum beats pounding. We are overwhelmed, elated, starstruck as the spectacular carriage crescendos past, cradling the King, his crowning destiny around the corner at Westminster Abbey.

Rain does its utmost to make this occasion as British as possible, dampening everything but the spirits of the people still lining the route. British stoicism at its best.

Historic happenings in the abbey embrace us outside - Zadok the Priest loudly resonates from crackling speakers also struggling with the wet as my raincoat seams finally succumb to the relentless water.

Feasting on Elizabethan Coronation Chicken sandwiches, nourishing hungry, bored tummies, three children calmly listen, leaning together, a damp huddle at our feet. The heavens open at the point we think it can't possibly get any wetter but no one moans.

Nearby, canons at Horse Guard's Parade exclaim with voracious pride the news that Charles the third has been crowned; rejuvenation from the hypnosis of waiting.

Heartily we sing the National Anthem, our voices lifting the weather, bringing calmness moments before the procession. Moments before pounding drums and joyful brass fill the air like tuneful harbingers; expectation courses up the street once more. Regiment after regiment, troop after troop: then we see the blue-ribboned Windsor Greys of the majestic Golden Carriage bringing him closer to us. Here he is! Wearing Imperial State Crown, he warmly scans the crowd, waves and each of us feel a connection with our new King. Giddy with elation, transfixed with jubilation, enthusiastically we wave on the following royalty, until the street cleaners' sweeping signals the end to loud applause.

Dead Interesting

A walk round a cemetery might not sound the most enthralling of outings!
However, Ian Tomes, working for Woking Borough Council, oversaw the recent
renovation of Brookwood Cemetery and gave Prime Timers a fascinating 1 mile, 1
hour tour in April.

Known originally as the London Necropolis, it was developed on 2268 acres of heathland from 1852 onwards to accommodate the increasing population of the capital and had its own railway from Waterloo to transport coffins and mourners.

The cemetery is divided into two parts either side of Cemetery Pales Road, the south side originally for Anglicans, the north side for Nonconformists (including Roman Catholics!) but today anvone may be buried here of whatever faith or none. It is the largest cemetery in Western Europe and is now designated a Grade I listed Park and Garden, with a Green Flag award, supporting some rare - even unique species, such as the green-winged orchid. Surrey Wildlife Trust assists with the management of internationally rare lowland heath and acid grassland, scarce in S.E. England.

We started our walk along part of the course of the railway, long closed, and



saw a station platform remnant hiding behind bushes. We looked along the 19th century avenue of Wellingtonias,

> now huge trees, and imagined what the recently planted avenue of them might look like in 150 years' time!

There are a number of Grade II listed monuments and Ian took us to admire some fine statuary of tall angels and busts of the dead and the tombstone, ornately-decorated with glass mosaics, of Giulio Salvati, a late 19th century Italian glass manufacturer. We saw the graves of a few notable people such as Nelson's



granddaughter and the wife of Titanic's captain, Sarah Eleanor Smith, who died tragically in a road accident. Young John Spencer, a railway employee, died in a rail accident and his gravestone has a beautiful carving of the old "top-hat funnel" steam locomotive that did for him! One unique tombstone had a cross carved out of it rather than being surmounted by a solid stone cross and one of the first Victoria Crosses, from the Crimean War, is commemorated on the gravestone of Pte William Reynolds, dated 1869.

We went inside the "Columbarium" where funerary urns rest in the "dove holes", including one discovered in a supermarket car park and never claimed! The basement of this classical style building was flooded to a depth of several feet, the recent weather having been so wet.

We met one of the four monks living near the little Greek Orthodox church, once the cemetery chapel, and he invited us in to see the colourful interior.

It would be well worth another.

Lemon Cake by Liz Silver



This cake is so lovely! Light, moist and very lemony with a delicious, tangy icing and a perfect bake for Summer.

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180°C, Fan 160°C, Gas 4.
- 2. Grease a 20cm bundt or round cake tin with the melted butter and sprinkle in the breadcrumbs or flour and swirl around until all sides of the tin are coated. Tip out any excess.
- 3. In a large mixing bowl, using an electric hand mixer, cream together the butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Beat in the eggs, one by one, until well combined
- 4. Sift in the flour, baking powder and a pinch of salt, and mix together using a low speed on the hand mixer or with a spoon until combined.
- 5. Add the lemon zest, juice, vanilla essence and a splash of milk and mix in well.
- 6. Transfer the cake mixture to the prepared tin and smooth level the surface.
- 7. Bake for 45-50 minutes, or until a skewer inserted into the cake comes out clean
- 8. Remove from the oven and leave in the tin until cool enough to handle. Carefully place a wire rack over the tin and tip it over to release the cake. Leave to cool completely. For the best result, store overnight in a cake tin to let the flavour and texture of the cake develop.
- 9. To make the icing, mix enough lemon juice (start with 2 tablespoons) into the icing sugar to give a thick but pourable icing, if it is too runny, add more sifted icing sugar.
- 10. Pour the icing over the cake and decorate with the lemon zest.
- 11. Will keep in an airtight tin for 3-4 days.

25g butter, melted
2tbsp fine dried
breadcrumbs or plain flour
250g butter, softened
300g golden caster sugar
4 large eggs
200g self-raising flour
1 tsp baking powder
Pinch of salt
Finely grated zest and juice
of 1 lemon
1 tsp vanilla essence
a splash of milk
Glacé Icing:
Pared zest and juice of 1
Iemon

250g icing sugar, sifted

Creation and Re-Creation

As the year goes through its natural cycle, we observe the passing of the seasons, as winter turns to spring, with its blossom and fresh green leaves. In a good year, spring soon turns to summer, with its longer, lighter days, warmth and sunshine. This year, it has taken a while, but all things come to those who wait ...

And here we are! Most of the summer term under our belts, exams all over (thank goodness, I hear some of you say) and just the results to come (eek! or hurrah! depending on how they have gone). Time to look forward, perhaps to holidays, or at least some rest and refreshment, however we choose to take it. Because, for most people, life is very full – a relentless round of activity and busy-ness, with little time to stand still and take stock, let alone any opportunity to reflect.

I'm sure it isn't meant to be like this. Whenever I read the gospels, I am always struck by the fact that Jesus was never in a hurry. Remarkably, he accomplished so much during the three brief years of his earthly ministry, without ever seeming to rush anywhere. We don't hear that he went to bed at night worrying about all the things he hadn't managed to fit into his day. Life seemed leisurely. There was always time for people. Nothing was more important than taking time to teach his disciples, pausing to heal an outcast, or speaking words of forgiveness. And of course, people walked everywhere, which is a great way of slowing down.

The Bible begins with a flurry of activity, as God embarks on his work of Creation. Genesis means 'beginnings' and, in the opening chapters, we see the first stirrings of life on earth, as God brings light and life to the universe. God's first command is "Let there be light!" and – once the light has come – the rest flows on from that. God speaks and things happen, and the phrase we read time and again is "and God saw that it was good". When God creates man and woman, they are the crown of his creation, which he declares to be "very good".

And then we read that "on the seventh day, God rested from all his work". If God, the creator of the universe, needed to take time for rest, refreshment and re-creation - in its fullest sense - how much more do we need to do the same.

Taking a holiday is not possible for everyone, but even if going away is not on



the cards, it is healthy to take a break from time to time. Maybe you have a beach holiday planned ... or climbing Snowdon ... or kayaking down the River Nile. Whatever you are hoping to do this summer, may I encourage you to make time for rest, refreshment and re-creation - from the inside out.




